Program Offerings

The school year is divided into three trimesters with a variety of activities offered in the Fall, Winter and Spring Trimesters. The school offers a combination of Faculty led activities on Tuesdays and Thursdays. These are supplemented by fee based activities led by outside vendors and offered Mondays – Fridays after school as well as part of a Saturday Program.

Additionally, our dormitory organizes and runs activities for our boarding students on Mondays

and Wednesdays.

Open Classes

During the last week of ASAs, parents are invited to campus to observe the last class of the trimester. The open classes are intended to show parents the learning process that students have engaged in during their ASAs this trimester. Depending on the activity, this may involve parents joining in with their child, parents may be watching the students engage in the activity or there could be a mini performance where students demonstrate their learning.

Registrations

SchoolsBuddy, our activities management system, is used for all programs that run after school. You will need access to your account for all sign-ups, communication and to see the scheduled events for your child/ren.

Activating your SchoolsBuddy account:

- You will receive an email from the school to activate your account. You need to create a password.
- If you forget your password, just click the 'forgotten password' button at the sign-in screen.

- You can use the application for any iOS or Android system by searching 'SchoolsBuddy' in the app store.

Attendance Procedures

By signing up for an ASA, students are committing to be present and involved in the activity.

Continual absences will result in a warning followed by dismissal from the ASA for the remainder of the session. Behavioral issues will be dealt with in the same manner with a warning followed by removal from the program. Day students with continual absences will be dismissed from the remainder of the ASA session. Dorm students that are absent (not excused) will receive dorm detention after GST. If a student has a retake, the student should ask their ASA instructor for permission ahead of time. If a student has not been granted permission from the ASA instructor, they will be marked as absent.





Communication

Excused absences require a parent email to be sent to Mr. Joe Zhao (joe.zhao@daischina.net), Mr. Hopkinson (david.hopkinson@daischina.net), Mr. Robinson (paul.robinson@daischina.net) and your ASA/Athletic teacher/coach ahead of time to ask for permission. All communication for outside vendors should be sent through the athletics and activities office. For any activity that occurs at DAIS/DHS, no money should be paid directly to the outside vendors. If you are asked for any additional fees or for a direct payment, please inform the athletics and activities office.

Change Requests

Families may request to change or drop an activity after the first day it has been offered. This also applies to paid activities and families will only be charged for the first class. Changes can only be made once per trimester.

Transportation

Transportation is available for an additional fee after Tuesday and Thursday activities when the minimum enrollment for the bus has been met. The buses will drop off at two locations in Dalian Development Zone and one in Dalian City. Families may register for the transportation service through *SchoolsBuddy* at the same time as registering for ASAs.

Payment for activities

Payment for all courses is made through our finance office. You will receive an email with payment information, or you may check your PowerSchool account at any time to complete payment. Payment for all activities is non-refundable. However, there are exceptions in the ASA refund policy. Payment should be made for activities within the deadlines stipulated by the school (normally within the first two weeks of the activity). If payment has not been made, the following actions will occur:

- Communication to parent or guardian that the payment is overdue.
- Child/ren will be removed from the activity if payment is still not made by the next time they meet.
- The child/ren will not be able to participate in any paid activities for the remainder of the year if a refusal to pay continues.
- * We understand that sometimes circumstances may not allow a family to pay by the set time. Please contact us through the Athletics & Activities office ahead of time in such cases.

The ASA Refund Policy

Students enrolled in any after school activity must notify the school 1 school day before the second scheduled class if deciding not to continue the activity. In the case where the activity includes fees, a prorata refund will be made in the month following cancelation.

No Refunds will be provided for any paid activity except where cancelation is received before the second class of the season activity.





Any incident of cancelation due to unforeseen school operational circumstances (for example but not limited to: Inclement weather, pollution, school scheduling incident conflict) will result in a fair attempt to reschedule the interrupted event or a class session refund will be made accordingly at the end of the season.



Multiple Activity Participation

Some ASAs involve a commitment of more than one day per week. Students who wish to participate in multiple activity that means not being able to fully commit to an ASA shall adhere to the stipulations in the Multiple Activity Participation form and obtain signed permissions from both Head Coach / Instructors, parents/guardians and the Athletic and Activities Director.

The school has an AQI reader on campus to monitor the most accurate data. AQI levels are checked at 11:00 a.m. each day and monitored continually whenever it exceeds 150. Outdoor ASA will be guided by the 2:00 p.m. reading and activities may be adapted and moved indoors in case of high AQI.
